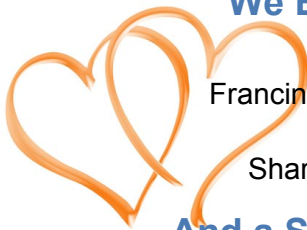

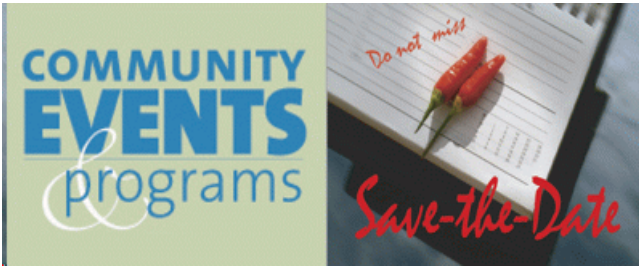

Brandeis and BNC Report Successful Fundraising Year



BNC experienced an excellent fundraising year, raising \$3,178,750, an increase of \$802,346 over FY09. Our own Carol Kern, immediate past president, and Leslie Pearlstein, national president, commend the efforts of all of our chapters in making this year so successful.

President Jehuda Reinharz reported that Brandeis concluded a remarkable fundraising year. He wrote that "despite the roiling of global financial markets the total cash received by June 30, 2010, was \$72 million" Notwithstanding the fundraising success in fiscal 2010, we must recognize that the philanthropic climate is different, and the University continues to face great challenges moving forward." President Reinharz thanked those "who worked tirelessly throughout the year to make these results possible." He continued "Once again, Brandeis supporters showed a remarkable commitment to the University at a crucial time in our history . . . I thank our devoted alumni, friends, trustees, parents, and members of the Brandeis National Committee for their generosity."

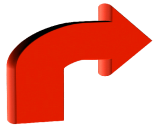

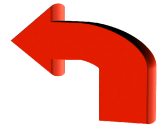

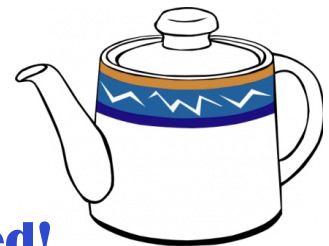
